The following exceptions apply: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>--Menlo College requires all graduates to complete the equivalent of MGT 002, ECO 055, and, depending on major, MTH 002 or MTH 010.</li> <li>--LIT 104 must be taken at Menlo College if student has not taken the equivalent of HIS 001 AND HIS 002.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• --Specific courses may be required as a prerequisite for Major and/or Concentration upper division courses.</li> <li>• Vocational Associates Degrees will not be accepted.</li> <li>• The following types of College of Marin course are not transferable to Menlo College: non-degree applicable, basic skills, preparatory, remedial, ESL, vocational and correspondence courses.</li> <li>• A grade of "C-" or better must be earned a course in order for the course to be considered for transfer credit.</li> <li>• College of Marin courses may only be taken once for transfer credit to Menlo College.</li> <li>• College of Marin courses may only satisfy one requirement at Menlo College.</li> <li>• College of Marin courses not specifically noted but which transfer to the University of California will transfer in as general elective units at Menlo College. College of Marin courses not specifically noted but which transfer to the California State University system will be considered for transfer as general elective units on a case-by-case basis.</li> <li>• Transfer students will receive credit for the total number of units accepted for transfer. However, grades received in transfer courses will not be counted in a student's Menlo College GPA.</li> <li>• All College of Marin courses are lower division. Lower division courses will not satisfy an upper division requirement even if course content is the same. Students may appeal this issue to the Faculty Appeals Committee.</li> <li>• Up to 70 semester units of lower division course work may be transferred to Menlo. A maximum of 4 semester units of P.E. will be accepted for transfer.</li> <li>• This agreement is subject to change; students may appeal transfer evaluation to the Faculty Appeals Committee.</li> </ul>
