- Approved Associate's Degrees or IGETC Certification will receive Full-Faith and Credit for General Education Requirements. The following exceptions apply:  
  - Menlo College requires all graduates to complete the equivalent of MGT 002, ECO 055, and, depending on major, MTH 002 or MTH 10.
  - LIT 104 must be taken at Menlo if there is no equivalent course to HUM 001 AND HUM 002.
  - Specific courses may be required as a prerequisite for Major and/or Concentration upper division courses.
- Vocational Associates Degrees will not be accepted.
- Students need to earn a grade of "C-" or better for the course to be considered for transfer credit.
- Gavilan College courses may be only taken once for transfer credit to Menlo College.
- Gavilan College courses numbered from 1 to 49, which do not fulfill specific Menlo College requirements, will be accepted for transfer as General Electives.
- Gavilan College courses numbered 50 to 99 in non-vocational programs will be considered for transfer on a course-by-course basis.
- Menlo College does not accept vocational or correspondence courses for transfer.
- Transfer students will receive credit for the total number of units accepted for transfer. However, grades received in transfer courses will not be counted in a student's Menlo GPA.
- Up to 70 semester units of lower division course work may be transferred to Menlo. A maximum of 4 quarter units of P.E. will be counted towards graduation.
- This agreement is subject to change and students may appeal transfer evaluation to Menlo Faculty Appeals Committee.
