LIT 104 must be taken at Menlo if there is no equivalent course to both HUM 001 AND HUM 002 Specific courses may be required as a prerequisite for Major and/or Concentration upper division courses. • Vocational Associates Degrees will not be accepted. • Marymount College courses not specifically noted but which transfer to the University of California will be accepted as general units for transfer credit at Menlo College. Marymount College courses which transfer to the California State University system will be considered for transfer acceptance on a case-by case basis. • Menlo College does not accept vocational or correspondence courses for transfer. • A single course cannot be used to fulfill more than one requirement. • Students need to earn a grade of "C-" or better for the course to be considered for transfer credit. • Courses may be taken only once for credit. • Transfer students will receive credit for the total number of units accepted for transfer. However, grades received in transfer courses will not be counted in a student's Menlo College GPA. • Up to 70 semester units of lower division course work may be transferred to Menlo College. No more than 4 semester units of physical education courses will count toward graduation. • This agreement is subject to change and students may appeal transfer evaluation to Menlo Faculty Appeals Committee
